## Macbeth Guided Reading Questions Act Three

As you read along with *Macbeth*, please answer the following questions completely to help with a better understanding of the play. You may be asked at a later date to provide these answers again!

- 1. What does Banquo mean when he says of Macbeth's ascension to the throne of Scotland, "...and I fear/Thou played'st most foully for it"? (Scene 1)
- 2. Macbeth has found out where Malcolm and Donalbain have escaped to. He says that they are not confessing to the murder of their father, but are "filling their hearers/With strange invention." What do you suspect Malcolm and Donalbain are doing? (Scene 1)
- 3. Why does Macbeth say of Banquo: "There is none but he/Whose being I do fear"? (Scene 1)
- 4. How does Macbeth convince the two men at the end of Scene 1 to kill Banquo?
- 5. Why doesn't Macbeth just kill Banquo himself? (Scene 1)
- 6. Who else does Macbeth tell the men to murder that night? Why? (Scene 1)
- 7. Why does Macbeth say he envies Duncan? (Scene 2)
- 8. Why does Macbeth not tell Lady Macbeth about his plans for Banquo and Fleance? How does this signal the beginning of a reversal of roles for husband and wife? (Scene 2)
- 9. At the end of Scene 1, Macbeth talked with 2 men (murderers). Why does a 3<sup>rd</sup> murderer join them in Scene 3? Who might this 3<sup>rd</sup> murderer be?
- 10. In what way does the murder plan go wrong? (Scene 3)
- 11. Is Banquo's ghost real or just another hallucination like the dagger from Act 2? Justify your answer! (Scene 4)
- 12. What excuses does Lady Macbeth make to the lords about Macbeth's weird behavior? (Scene 4)
- 13. What behavior of Macduff does Macbeth find troubling? (Scene 4)
- 14. Why does Macbeth want to seek out and talk to the witches again? (Scene 4)
- 15. What news do we learn about Macduff in Scene 6?
